Welcome to the Back-to-School Edition of the MMLA Newsletter,

In this newsletter you'll find information about the MMLA convention, including how to register and reserve a hotel room, how to find a roommate, and how to apply for a travel award and the graduate student paper prize. You'll also find reminders about essay and book-review <u>submissions to the JMMLA</u>. Deadlines for these various items are the following:

- September 1: register for the convention (just ten days left before late registration fees go into effect)
- October 1: apply for a convention travel award
- October 1: submit an essay to the JMMLA's "Intelligence" issue
- October 11: reserve a room at the convention hotel
- October 15: enter to win the graduate student paper prize

Registering for the convention is easy! Please do so through our new member portal.

Here's how:

If you are a current or previous member of the MMLA, you have received an invitation from our new membership portal, MemberClicks, which will prompt you to log in and set up your password. Once completed, you will be prompted to renew your membership (if necessary).

If you did not receive an invitation from our membership portal, MemberClicks, you can become a member of the MMLA by creating an account on <u>our new website</u>. In doing so, you will be prompted to complete a member profile and pay for a one-year membership online.

With this new platform, members have access to their profiles and member-only resources. Establish or renew your membership and register for our Fall 2023

Convention prior to September 1st.

Once you've registered for the convention you can explore the Member Discussion Forums for roommates and rideshares for the convention hotel. <u>Hotel reservations</u> can be made at the member rate (\$189/night) until October 11th and can be canceled without penalty three business days prior to arrival.

- A brief cover letter asking to be considered for a travel award and indicating other institutional sources of support, if any. Note that the MMLA will give preference to students who demonstrate need.
- An abstract for the paper to be presented at the conference.
- A CV indicating your expected graduation date.

Graduate Student Paper Prize

The MMLA Graduate Student Paper Prize contest is open to all graduate student members of the MMLA who will be presenting papers during our annual convention. Interested students must send the following by **October 15** to mmla@luc.edu with "Graduate Student Paper Prize" in the subject line of the submission email.

- Your most recent CV
- Your paper accepted to the upcoming convention (limit of 3,000 words, exclusive of the Works Cited page)

Submissions will be reviewed by the MMLA Program Committee, and the winning paper will be announced during the keynote speech of the convention and published in *The Journal of the Midwest Modern Language*Association. The prize also comes with a cash award of \$100, and a guest membership and registration for the following MMLA convention.
