IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Registration

If you are a **current or previous member** of the MMLA, you have received an invitation from our new membership portal, MemberClicks, which will prompt you to log in and set up your password. Once completed, you will be prompted to renew your membership (if necessary).

If you did not receive an invitation from our membership portal, MemberClicks, you can **become a member** of the MMLA by creating an account on <u>our new website</u>. In doing so, you will be prompted to complete a member profile and pay for a one-year membership online.

Once you are officially a current MMLA member, you'll be able to register for the convention <u>here</u>. Registration will remain open throughout the convention. Late registration will remain open throughout the convention, and all presenters must register in order to appear in the final, official program.

<u>Hotel reservations</u> for the Hyatt Regency Cincinnati can be made at the member rate (\$189/night) **until October 11th** and can be canceled without penalty three business days prior to arrival.

- An abstract of the paper to be presented at the conference
- Your most recent CV

Grad students please note that the MMLA will give preference to students who demonstrate need.
