May 1	- All Pre-Organized Panel, Workshop, and Individual Paper proposals for the annual Convention or Undergraduate Research Symposium MUST be submitted to the MMLA.



JMMLA Fall 2025 Call for Submissions on the theme "Health in/of the Humanities"

The Journal of the Midwest Modern Language Association is accepting submissions for a Fall 2025 issue on the theme of "Health in/of the Humanities." We invite submissions that contribute new insights into the evolving relationship between health and the humanities, and what this relationship might tell us about the health of the humanities both now and in the future. To this end, we seek submissions that address topics such as health subcultures, disability studies, medical humanities, and beyond.
