## Limited Space for Fully Virtual Panels at the 2025 Convention

The MMLA's Executive Committee unanimously voted to grant **limited space for fully virtual sessions** during each day of the 2025 Convention. Applicants must indicate their preferred format (in-person or virtual) at the time of submitting their pre-organized panel, workshop, and/or individual-paper proposal(s). Once accepted, participants may not request to change the format of their presentation.

#### **Important Reminders:**

- Unless traveling to Milwaukee, virtual attendees will be limited in their participation to other virtual panels only.
- If applying to present on a Permanent Section panel at MMLA 2025, please be aware of the organizer's chosen format, which is listed in <u>each section's CFP on our member portal</u>.
- The MMLA's <u>Undergraduate Research Symposium</u> will be fully in-person for 2025. No virtual or hybrid panels will be scheduled.

#### Not So Fast! Wait Until After July 1st to Become a Member of the MMLA!

Why wait? Because MMLA memberships follow a fiscal-year calendar, meaning they run from July 1st of one year through June 30th of the next year. If you join now, your membership will expire in just three months. If you wait until after July 1st, your membership will last twelve months, including the upcoming 2025 convention in November. Membership is required to participate in the convention, but you don't need it to submit an abstract or propose a session, so go ahead and send those items to us, and postpone your MMLA membership until after July 1st. Sometimes procrastination is the right choice!

### 2025 Convention Calls for Papers Available Now!

Submit an abstract to an MMLA <u>Permanent Section</u> or <u>Pre-Organized Panel</u>. Browse the topics to find a session that matches your research interests. Your paper proposals to these sessions are due to the session organizer by his/her imposed deadline, but no later than **April 25th**.

April 25	- Individual-paper proposals to a Permanent Section or Pre- Organized Panel are due
May 1	<ul> <li>All Pre-Organized Panel, Workshop, and Individual Paper Proposals for the annual Convention or Undergraduate Research Symposium MUST be submitted to the MMLA</li> <li>Permanent Section organizers MUST submit their panel details to the MMLA</li> </ul>
July 1	<ul> <li>Registration opens for MMLA Convention and Undergraduate Research Symposium</li> <li>Applications for a Lodging Award and the annual Book Award are due</li> </ul>
